SARS CoV-2 (COVID-19) by PCR

Remarks

- 1) SARS CoV-2 virus, also known as, 2019-nCoV is the causative agent of COVID-19 disease.
- 2) A Detected result indicates the presence of SARS CoV-2 RNA in the clinical specimen. A Not Detected result indicates the absence of SARS CoV-2 RNA in the clinical specimen.
- 3) The assay targets E gene (B-βCoV specific) / S gene / N gene / ORF1ab (SARS CoV-2 specific). Amplification of only one of the two target genes may be due to low viral load levels, close to the limit of detection (LOD) of the test, or due to a mutation in one of the two target sequences.
- 4) Negative results could occur due to very low viral load or clearance of SARS CoV-2 virus. A negative result, particularly from an upper respiratory specimen, does not exclude infection.
- 5) A positive alternate pathogen, does not necessarily rule out COVID-19, as little is known about the rate of co-infections. All the results should always be correlated with clinical status and history of the patient.
- 6) This is a qualitative test and results are not indicative of the viral load in the tested specimen. Variability in host or virus specific factors, specimen collection technique, specimen transport & storage, etc., can lead to variation in the Ct value. Hence, Ct values should not be considered an absolute indicator of viral load.

Limitations: PCR is a highly sensitive technique; common reasons for paradoxical results are contamination during specimen collection, selection of inappropriate specimen and inherent PCR inhibitors in the sample.
